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Looking Ahead

As Michigan continues “reopening” following the MI Safe Start Plan, Senior Neighbors wants to emphasize our commitment to remaining available to our seniors, despite anticipating a slower re-opening process for us given the vulnerability of those we serve. Our highest priority is ensuring the health and safety of the older adults we serve, as well as our volunteers and staff, many of whom are considered members of an at-risk population.

Thus, we will continue seeking guidance from local and national health authorities and implementing their recommendations on extra safety precautions for our staff and seniors as well as adhering to a phased approach for reopening.

Given much of our work involves people being physically close to one another: congregate meals, social activities, transportation, volunteering, group exercise, case management and home maintenance, we will continue to temporarily pause or modify some services and activities to ensure safety for all.

As we move forward with resuming programs and services, we will align our reopening process with those of our partner agencies in order to balance what may be different timelines and approaches. Finally, our case management team is always available to help clients receive access to much needed services or crisis intervention, ensuring they are never alone.
